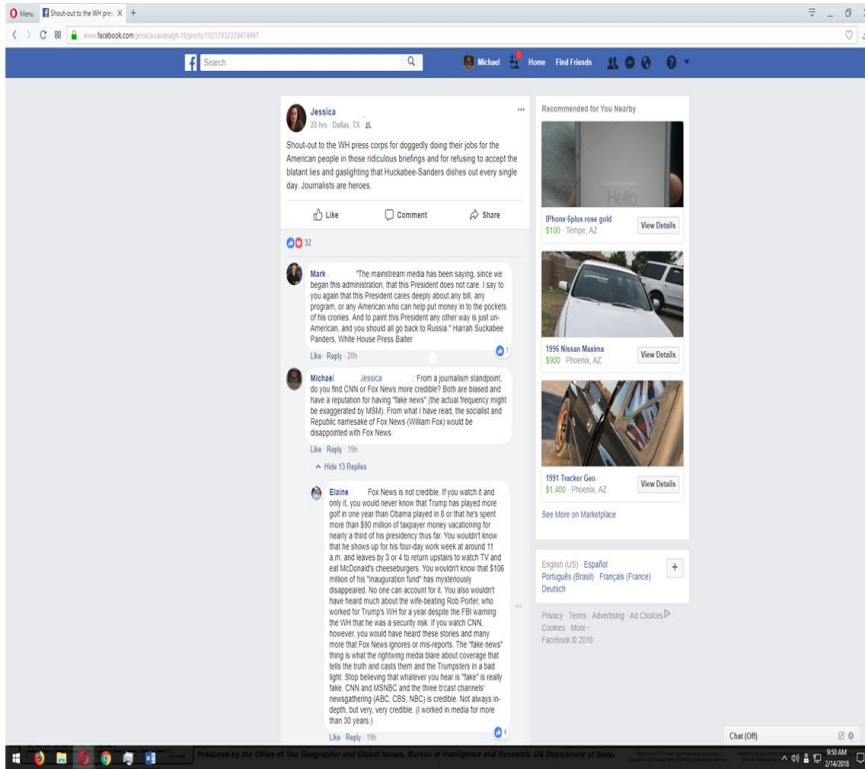


The 1st 4 screenshots show posts that (counting the opening to last posts shown) happened on 2/13/18@about 2PM and ended about 17 hours later.

Michael said: "Just a gentle reminder that the NFL is a garbage organization with a long trail of abused women in its wake and a new sexual harassment allegation, along with the fact that they don't care if their players die due to multiple concussions. We would boycott any other organization with their history."

While I personally don't know if myself would use the "garbage" I agree with your point. Also, just a gentle reminder that just as there is a "long trail of abused women" there is also a long trail of women who make up claims on. Sure, there are probably much more real cases of abuse, but I consider false abuse claims to be even more damning.

Kelly said: "I So blame the women - that's what you're trying to do! I mean let's not blame all the women who've been abused on rape. Let's set aside murder, rape, assault, robbery, dog fighting, animal abuse, total disregard for player safety and health - but... See how..."

Michael said: "You see, I have read about so many of these... assault/rape claims (I guess I am desensitized to it. Honestly, I might be starting to think that an actress is lying when the latest claim comes out. However, a side of me is open that she was attacked. The reason why I find these rape claims more damning are because it ruins the life of a person that did not do it and it makes harder for actual victims to come forward. Going with the blame thing, if a woman was not raped at all by anyone in her life up to that point but falsey claims are made, I am blaming her in part for ruining that person's life."

Kelly said: "Michael the percentage of false rape claim is a whopping 18%. So all these supposed false rape claims are often women who realize how horrifying our criminal justice system is, especially when it comes to people with fame and fortune and they take the payout because it's a hell of a lot more than they'll ever get from a court of law."

Kelly said: "As of 20 years ago nearly 15 million American women had been the victims of attempted or complete rape. 1 in 3 women will be sexually assaulted in their lifetime. (I'm so sorry you've been desensitized to the everyday reality of women who then have to go on trial, be harassed and often drop the charges not because they are false but to the system puts the victim in trial."

Michael said: "If 1 in 3 Amer. women were actually raped/sexually assaulted/sexually harassed, then that could be in the 0-figures. Stats tend to take a select amount and try to apply to an overall population. If you say "1 in 3 surveyed or reported Amer. women" I will believe that more."

Kelly said: "Don't do you honestly think people make these statistics up? In the wake of the me too movement you're still saying with these statistics must be false? Seriously? The 1 in 3 statistic is of the sexual assaults and rapes that are REPORTED. The statistic for men is 1 in 5. Thank you for showing everyone on social media your true colors. Well done sir. Well done. For the sake of all the women in your life, get educated and be a better man. Be a better human being. Don't be part of the problem. There's a reason you aren't hearing about it - it's because you don't want to, and since you open your mouth and share your views, no survivor is ever going to share their story with you. That's why we have the me too movement - because too many people like you spend your time questioning the statistics instead of listening to the experiences."

Michael said: "Certain stats I do think some people are making up. Be that crime or anti-crime."
